# ISRO successfully launched PSLV-C60



ISRO - Indian Space Research Organisation successfully launched PSLV-C60 with SpaDeX and innovative payloads from Satish Dhawan Space Centre Sriharikota. India now becomes the fourth country to join the select league of nations to seek Space docking, through its own indigenously developed "Bharatiya Docking System" that will pave the way for journey beyond the skies for "Gaganyaan" and "Bharatiya Antriksha Station".



### Ambassador meets Foreign Minister



Ambassador Subhash Gupta met with H.E. Amb. Albert R. Ramdin, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Suriname, along with his team on 10 December 2024. The Minister conveyed deep appreciation for the India-Caricom Summit and the fruitful meeting held between President Santokhi and PM Modi. The discussions encompassed a broad range of topics aimed at enhancing ongoing collaborations, streamlining partnerships, and providing updates on grant assistance projects.



Ambassador Subhash Gupta along with Amb Joan Illahi of BIBIS co-chaired the Project Steering Committee meetings of the Quick Impact Projects in Suriname at the Embassy on 10 December 2024. The Committee reviewed the progress of implementation of the four ongoing projects: Sustainable Support for a Chemical Teaching Laboratory at ADEKUS, Rehabilitation of DC Roblesplein in Nickerie, Upgrading IT Equipment for ICT Education at NATIN and Development of a Synthetic Jogging Track at Lelydorp, District of Wanica. Representatives of the PSC from the various stakeholder institutions participated in the meeting.



High Commissioner of India to Saint Vincent and the Grenadines resident in Paramaribo, Amb.Subhash Gupta and Hon. Frederick Stephenson, Minister of Foreign Affairs, Foreign Trade and Consumer Affairs of Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, signed an agreement regarding Indian Grant Assistance for the implementation of Quick Impact Projects aimed at enhancing community infrastructure across the country funded by the Government of India.

The agreement marks another significant step towards the deepening of bilateral relations between India and SVG. Foreign Minister Stephenson underscored that "This partnership exemplifies our shared vision of empowering communities and creating opportunities for the development and well-being of the residents. We are deeply grateful to the Government of India for their unwavering support and cooperation"





High Commissioner, Subhash Gupta, accompanied by Ms. Simran, US(DPA-III) from the Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi and NABCONS (NABARD Consultancy - implementation partner), COO Dr. Haragopal Yandra, visited Barbados to lead discussions relating to a Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) project.

During the tour, the delegation visited Export Barbados and held consultations with CEO of Export Barbados, Mr. Mark Hill and the team. The Barbadian side also organized a site visit for the delegation to assess the project's viability and gather necessary inputs for its development. As part of the assessment tour, the delegation visited the International Food Science Center facility.

The proposed USD 1 million project funded by India, will be utilized to provide machinery to boost agricultural development through value addition in partner countries like Barbados.



Automatic Weather Station in Kwamalasamutu was set up recently under India UN Development Partnership Fund to support Surinamese indigenous people towards building resilience against flooding and improving weather forecast through the installation of enhanced early warning systems.


